They demonstrate this love of neighbor in their dedication to their vocation as educators and their interactions with the children every day.


I believe that every child deserves the opportunity to be educated in a Catholic school. It is our desire to keep our unique

Letter From Ave Maria Academy Principal

L he 2022-2023 school year was another resounding success at Ave Maria Academy. Thanks to the dedication

of our teachers and staff and the generosity of our benefactors, Ave Maria continued to be a beacon for Catholic education in the Northwest metro.

In *Gravissimum educationis*, the Church lays out the high calling of a Catholic school to, "create for the school community a special

atmosphere animated by the Gospel spirit of freedom and charity, to help youth grow according to the new creatures they were made through baptism,... and finally to order the whole of human culture to the news of salvation so that the knowledge the students gradually acquire of the world, life, and man is illumined by faith." This vision, to form our students in the harmony of faith and reason, so as to send them out to order the greater culture to the Lord, is most certainly a challenging task. It is one that requires helping our students to see themselves and the world around them through the eyes of faith. It is also one that requires an intimate knowledge of the world God made so that we might know Him in His fullness and beauty.

One of the great blessings of Ave Maria's approach to elementary education is its rootedness in the liberal arts tradition. It opens the students to a broad appreciation of the various aspects of human knowledge and invites them to enter into it with awe and wonder. One of my great intellectual heroes, the English preacher and educator St. John Henry Newman, observes the following of education thus conceived, "All branches of knowledge are connected together, because the subject-matter of knowledge is intimately united in itself, as being the acts and the work of the Creator" (*The Idea of a University, p. 75*). We daily strive to form in our students the habit of mind to see this unity in all they learn, so that when they go forth from our halls they can see the world around them as a wonderfully complex relationship of knowledge and truth that ultimately leads them and others to the Truth who is Jesus Himself (Cf. Jn. 14:6).

I am truly grateful to all of you who have worked so hard and given so generously in the past year to make the work of Catholic education possible here at Ave Maria Academy. We have an important mission, not only in the lives of our students, but, through them, in the life of the Church. While we give thanks for the many blessings and successes of the 2022-2023 school year, may we continue to trust in the Lord's providence to accomplish it well in the year ahead.

DISCIPLESHIP IN ACTION




